C) MEETINGS HELD IN 2006

A number of meetings were held by the Commission and various sub-committees in 2006:

- C.1) ACCS Commission met twice.
- C.2) Steering Committee met twice.
- C.3) Religious Education Committee met several times to discuss the Diploma in RE and to develop the Religious Education Programme
- C.4) Policies Committee met once.
- C.5) An ad hoc Planning Group met three times to plan the seminar for School Management Committees and to follow up after the seminar.

D) PRINCIPALS' COMMISSIONING & COMMITMENT OF SERVICE

The Principals' Commissioning & Commitment of Service ceremony was held at the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Succor on 21 January 2006. Three new principals were commissioned. The total number of persons who attended the event was 120 – His Grace, Archbishop Nicholas Chia and Msgr Eugene Vaz, Principals, Vice-Principals, Chairpersons from School Management Committees (SMCs) and their families, Heads of Religious Communities sponsoring schools, School Supervisors and ACCS Commissioners and Committee Members.

E) SEMINARS IN 2006

ACCS conducted a seminar for School Management Committee members, Heads of religious communities sponsoring schools and School Supervisors on 18 November 2006 at Catholic Junior College. The theme of the seminar was *Building a Catholic School Community*.

Participants. There was good support from eighty-four (84) participants. Those attending were His Grace, Archbishop Nicholas Chia, Msgr Eugene Vaz, heads of religious communities sponsoring

schools, chairpersons and members from School Management Committees (SMCs), school supervisors, some principals and vice-principals and ACCS commissioners and committee members.

Seminar content. The seminar opened with an address by His Grace. Participants were involved in discussions on issues relating to the SMCs and school management, and issues relating to principals and school leadership. The intent was to arrive at a common understanding and agreement on the direction of Catholic school education in Singapore, and to build a vibrant and united Catholic School Community.

F) RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS

A key initiative of ACCS is the development of a comprehensive religious education programme for Catholic secondary schools. The programme being developed is intended to provide for the spiritual formation of all students from Sec 1 to Sec 4/5, a well as to promote the distinctive Catholic character and ethos of the schools. The unit "Choices," the first of five planned units of the RE programme for secondary schools was completed and issued to the schools in September 2006 for trial implementation.

G) DIPLOMA IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The Diploma in Religious Education was launched in February 2006. The Diploma is meant for lay Catholic educators who are striving to build up the Catholic ethos, guide the mission orientation and live the spirituality of the founding spirit in Catholic schools. The Catholic educator is called to inculcate Gospel values with courage, discern choices in the context of secular demands, and make decisions that are congruent to her/his faith without fear. The task of formation therefore begins with the Catholic educator who is open to respond to the mission of living the vocation of love as a Catholic leader in school.

Programme Design:

Experience: The program is designed to consider the psychological and spiritual diversity and growth of the individual Catholic educator. The starting point of the theological enterprise begins with the educator.

Discern From this context the educator discerns with the knowledge of Faith and Sacred Revelation, within the psycho-spiritual dynamics of her/his personality and by the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Respond The introduction to theology enables the educator to process ways of making faith and moral decisions as a leader in school.

Worship The program pauses for prayer and liturgy for integration.

Time Frame:

The Diploma in RE is a two-year course of 160 hours. The Certificate in RE is a provision for those, with valid reasons, who are able to complete only the first 80 hours.

Course Content for 2006:

Module 1: Anthropology of the Personal Vacation

Module 2: The Catholic Educator in School

Module 3: Contextual Theology

Module 4: Moral Choices

Participants: The course began with 41 students. Two students withdrew due to illness.

Requirements:

Each teacher must attend at least 80% of each module, read the course materials and complete the assignments.

Course Fees: Fee was \$870.00 for 1st year and \$980.00 for 2nd year.
